These services are provided to support three major objectives designed to encourage and promote a stable, diverse and strong business community.

- Encouraging New Investment in Cambridge

- Assisting Small Business and New Entrepreneurs to Establish in Cambridge



Encouraging New Investment in Cambridge

- Provide a supply of serviced, graded industrial land for sale, which is ready for immediate construction.
- Develop and compile targeted, strategic economic development data and information to support business decision making.
- Assist prospective investors with site selection research including detailed statistical and market information on the City's business environment.
- Publish an inventory of available privately owned and city-owned land for sale, as well as industrial and commercial buildings for sale or lease.
- Act as community salesperson and goodwill ambassador; participate in trade shows, investment seminars, special events and host visiting delegations.
- Act as the principal liaison between City Council and the business community, and facilitate dealings with various City Departments.



Supporting Existing Businesses with Their Expansion Needs

- Have regular contact with the business community through networking and the business retention program - to identify needs and challenges and assist in improving the overall business climate.
- Bring companies together to foster local procurement, joint ventures, technology transfer opportunities, and strategic partnerships.
- Encourage and participate in partnerships, business networks and industry cluster development.
- Provide information on government programs and services available to business such as trade missions and export opportunities.



Assisting Small Business and New Entrepreneurs to Establish in Cambridge.

- Act as counselor, referral agent and facilitator to meet the needs of new and emerging small business enterprises
- Provide information, consulting assistance, seminars and resource material through the Waterloo Region Small Business Centre (WRSBC)
- The Centre, located at Cambridge City Hall is an independent private/public centre developed to encourage and contribute to the enterprising spirit and economic development of our community
- On-line Provincial business registration assistance is available through the WRSBC - Cambridge office
